## Reading rewards and a family reading challenge

We hope you can help us promote the love for reading in our school. Becoming fluent in reading and enjoying it is crucial for all children, in the last year we have upped the number of sessions the children have in school to do just this. Reading is one of the core homework tasks we ask all children to do, it really makes the difference in their education and understanding in each subject. Going forwards there will be rewards to collect for all children who read or share a book five times a week with a home adult, or with an older sibling - when it is signed in their reading record book (this needs to come in every day to school please for in school reading and rewards will be presented in Monday assemblies). If they achieve this for six weeks there is an additional reward for each child. These rewards will run throughout the year.

We running a family reading challenge, if you would like to take part, we are asking you to submit a photograph of your whole family reading with a caption that tells us what your family loves about reading. The prize will go to the family who is reading in the most unusual/ fun location, or the most unusual/fun way and who have told us about what they love about reading- remember you can read magazines and comics too! The closing date for entries will be $30^{\text {th }}$ November, please submit via the admin email, or via class dojo or Tapestry. Please let us know two things when you do submit your photo and caption, whether you mind your entry being shared with other families via dojo or Tapestry, and whether we can share it on our website too. Reading top tip: Turning subtitles on while people watch television helps them develop their reading skills and fluency in reading.

    ## Dyslexia update- a very proud moment

    I am proud of the children and our school every day and I mentioned last week about the children who underwent the dyslexia assessments being a credit to us. I now have permission to share why I said this with you- an assessor from Indigo House who assesses a vast amount of people and with a large number of schools said this...
    "Can I just say how lovely all the children I saw were. Even though I was making them complete very challenging assessments in a strange environment they did everything I asked of them with determination and good humour, even those with obvious additional needs. Some who had quite severe difficulties with literacy were also attacking the tasks with a base level of phonics skills that shows interventions have taken place and are helping. In my experience this willingness to try and fail at very difficult tasks shows a nurturing learning environment."
